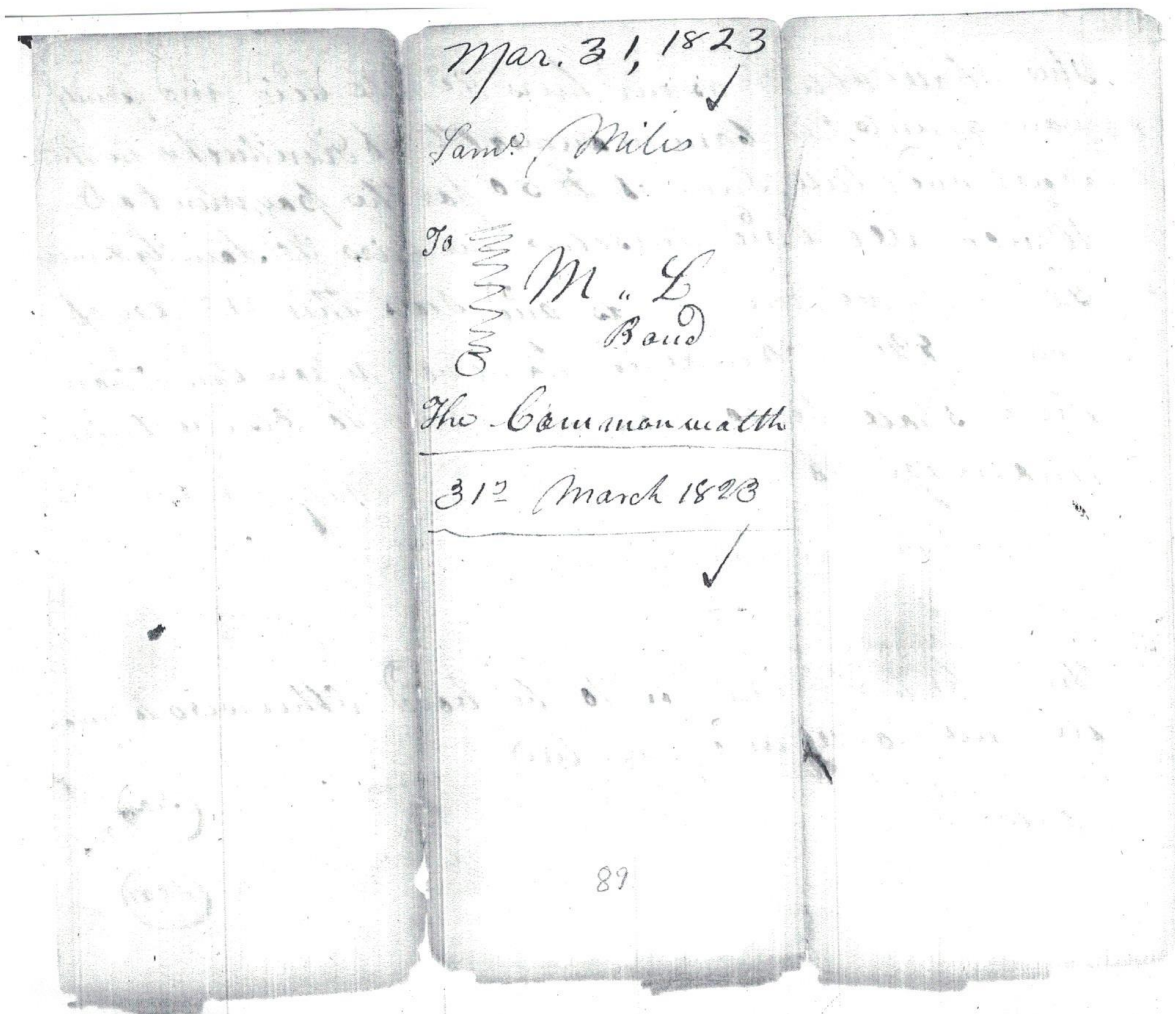

you to issue and grant to Samuel Miles of

the purpose of uniting according to law in the
lawful ties of matrimony being about the age
of thirty seven in witness whereof I have here
unto set my hand and seal Mary Vardiman (seal)
