





Discussion between Louise Carter Vardiman and Michelle Vardiman Fansler in May 1999:

The Vardiman's had a brown/orange colored shepherd dog named Bill. It was a great farm dog. Miles Vardiman, Ross and Phil's father, would attach a note to the dog's collar and say, "Go to Mollie". Bill was well trained and smart, he would run to the house and Mollie would read the note and send back the hammer or whatever they needed in the field by attaching it to Bill's collar.

Bill loved to eat ice cream out of a bowl. Louise remembers seeing the dog eating ice cream out of a bowl at times when she went past the Vardiman house.

Phil had lots of good veterinary practice on Bill whenever he would get cuts or scrapes from fights or whatever. Phil operated on Bill at times and Bill survived.

Phil kept Bill after he married Louise. Billie was named after the dog. The dog lived to be quit old. When they lived in Pacific, Missouri they let the dog live in the basement in winter and outside during the summers. Bill crawled up the stairs and died with his nose by the door leading into the house.

















Miles and Mollie Vardiman

"They were quit different from each other. He loved to talk and he loved to tell about things that happened in his life. And she would say, "Oh shut up Miles." She just couldn't stand it of him talking so much. And they were different. He wanted to stay to one political party and she refused to give up the Democrats. They had many a row. Neither one would give in. But Grandpa Miles was the most learned man. His family was. He kept an ear to the news and he wanted to know what was going on in the nation. Anything that was important he knew. Grandma Mollie couldn't care less. She was a beautiful girl. She was from a farm family, and they were very very poor. Grandpa Miles saw her and she was the one he wanted so he married her.

Larry's Memories:

(Larry Vardiman, Glimpses of My Childhood, cassette tape #1A)

Phillip's oldest son, Larry Vardiman, remembers visiting the farm as a child. Their farm house had a wooden floor and they owned a black couch with buttons that made out into an uncomfortable bed. He remembers playing with an old top that would spin on the floor. Larry remembers a story about Grandpa Vardiman "He was working out on the farm somewhere and was putting up barb wire fence. The wire broke and ripped him up pretty bad and apparently his health didn't do too well after that."

The "Only recollection I have of him was lying in bed out in the old farm house there. We used to go out and visit on Sundays and have chicken and dumplings that Grandma would make. I remember Grandpa and Grandma going out on Saturday evening and cutting a chicken's head off and plucking the feathers. Then Sunday we would have mounds of fried chicken, potatoes and gravy." Miles Vardiman died in 1949 at the age of 69 years old when Larry was five years old.
