22 May 1740 O.S, p. 489

Megginson to Clear road.

On the motion of William Megginson leave is granted him to Clear a road from his house to Willis's River Bridge.

17 June 1740 O.S., p. 489

Beverdam Bridge.

The Court Impower Col^o William Randolph Jun^r to take up money on Interest to pay M^r Thom^s Pleasants twenty pounds for building a Bridge over Beverdam Creek and keeping it in Repair for fifteen Years from this day.

17 June 1740 O.S., p. 490

Mychunk Bridge.

Workmen are Appointed to appear at the next Court to undertake the Building a Bridge over Mychunk Creek.

15 July 1740 O.S., p. 494

Road to be Clear'd.

On the Petition of James Martin, John McCord, Tho^s Morrison, James Robinson, John Reid, Samuel & James Bell, John Weads, John & James Daben William Verdeman, John Small and Lazarus Small leave is granted them to Clear a Road from the Thorrowfare a little above Morrisons to the Secretarys fford.

15 July 1740 O.S., p. 495

Surveyor of Road.

Joseph Anthony is Appointed Surveyor of the Road in the room of John White.

15 July 1740 O.S., p. 495

Bridge to be built

The Court agree with ffrans James to Build a bridge over Mychunk Creek for Twenty pounds Curr^t money. and to be discharg'd from keeping the same in Repair on the Delivery thereof.

15 July 1740 O.S., p. 499

Surveyor of Road.

Obediah Woodson is Appointed Surveyor of the Road from Brooks mill to the fork of Appamattox River.

19 Aug. 1740 O.S., p. 510

Road to be Clear'd.

Ord^r that a Road be Cleared from Maj^r Stoner's Road to Lyles's fford on Appamattox River.

18 Nov. 1740 O.S., p. 518

Surveyor of road.

Richard Moseby is Appointed Surveyor of the road in the room of Benjamin Moseby.

15 Sept. 1741 O.S., p. 3

Road to be Clear'd

On the Petition of James Bell, William Verdeman, William Miller, Peter Hairston, Edward Molloy, Thomas Bell, James Bell, Jun^r John & Thomas & Hugh Dobbins, Thomas & Charles Hughes, William White, Davis Stockdon, Alexander Reid, John Heard, Samuel Bell, William Morrison, John Roberts, David Martin, James Armour, James Robertson, John ffulton, Geo: Powel, John M^cCord, Sam^l Arnett, Richard Stockdon, Thomas Stockdon & Hum Dobbins. Leave is given them to Clear a road from Thomas Morrisons to the D.S. tree in Michael Woods road. And that the Petitioners be exempt from working on any other road.

On the Petition of David Lewis, George Taylor, William Hargis, Samuel Stiles, James ffidler, Hugh ffrazier, Howard Cash, James Treland, David Lewis, Jun^r, Cha^s Caffry David Rees, William Lewis, Abraham Slaten, & William Williams. leave is granted them to Clear a road from the Secretarys fford to the D.S. tree. And that the Petitioners be exempt from working on any other road.

On the Petition of Michael Woods, John Woods, William Woods, Archibald Woods, Michael Woods Jun^r William Wallace, Dennis Doyle, John Jemison Sam^l Jemison, Henry Baily, Andrew Wallace, Andrew M^cWilliams, Robert M^cNeely, James Henderson & James Kinkead leave is given them to Clear a road from the D.S. tree to Michael Woods. And that the Petitioners be exempt from working on any other road.

15 Sept. 1741 O.S., p. 5

Surveyor of Road.

Anthony Bennin is appointed Surveyor of the Road from Barnets road over Willis River at Horn Quarter fford to Glovers road. And that Benj^a Harrisons, James Watkins, Benjamin Witt, Peter Chastain, Meridith Manning, Cap^t Barnets' Nowel Burton, Richard Burton, Alexander Trent's, Uriah Print, Jacob Winfrey, Samuel Allin, Robert Sanders and their Titheables do Clear the same.

15 Sept. 1741 O.S., p. 5

Road to be opened.

Ordered that the old road over Deep Creek in the Chapple be opened and that James Barnes and George Stovals Gangs do open the same.

15 Sept. 1741 O.S., p. 6

Road to be Grubb'd

Ordered that the Gangs under ffred. Cox and Anthony Hughes do joyn & grubb the road from the Chapple road to Deep Creek Road.
